

I-95 Beltway & I-66 west to I-81 south. Take Exit 257, Left on Mayland Rd (Rt 259) 370 ft, Right on N Valley Pike (Rt 11) 2.1mi, Left on Martz Rd (Rt 806) 3.4 mi, Right on Mountain Valley Rd (Rt 620) 1.8 mi, Left on Armentrout Path (Rt 722), stay to the right at the big sign and continue straight up the hill to Blessings Lodge.

From Richmond/Tidewater:

I-64 west to I-81 north, to Exit 251, Follow Harrisonburg Instructions.

From Harrisonburg:

I-81 north. to Exit 251, Right on N, North Valley Pike (Rt 11) 3.3 mi, Right on Fellowship Rd (Rt 721) 1.1mi, Left on Indian Trail Rd (Rt 717) 0.4 mi, Right on Fridley's Gap Rd (Rt 811) 2.5 mi, continue straight on Mountain Valley Rd (Rt 620) .0.3 mi , Right on Armentrout Path (Rt 722), stay to the right at the big sign and continue straight up the hill to Blessings Lodge

Our speaker, Peter Moon was born in Nashville, TN and raised in Rockville, MD. He graduated from the University of Washington in Seattle with a degree in Aeronautical and Astronautical Engineering. Following graduation, he served as a Naval

Flight Officer aboard the aircraft carriers USS Kitty Hawk and USS Ranger, flying A6E Intruder aircraft and subsequently served as a flight instructor. In 1988, he left the U.S Navy to attend Union Theological Seminary (now Union Presbyterian) in Richmond, VA. Since then, he has served multiple appointments in Richmond, Fairfax, Farmville, and for the last thirteen years at Woodlake. He has also completed a DMIN at Wesley Theological Seminary.

Pete has served in Conference leadership in multiple ways including ten years on the Board of Ordained Ministry and a term as a Vice Chair of the Board. Along with other Boards and Agencies, he has served as the chair of the Five Talent Academy and has represented the Conference as a Jurisdictional Delegate in 2004, and as a delegate to General Conference in 2008, 2012, 2016, and 2019. In 2015, he was appointed as the Richmond District Superintendent.

He and his wife Lynn have been married thirty-one years and have five children and two perfect grandchildren.

In his spare time, Pete enjoys running, cycling, woodworking, and car repair. He is currently writing a book about the hope we find in the basic and enduring message of the gospel as seen in the Methodist tradition.
